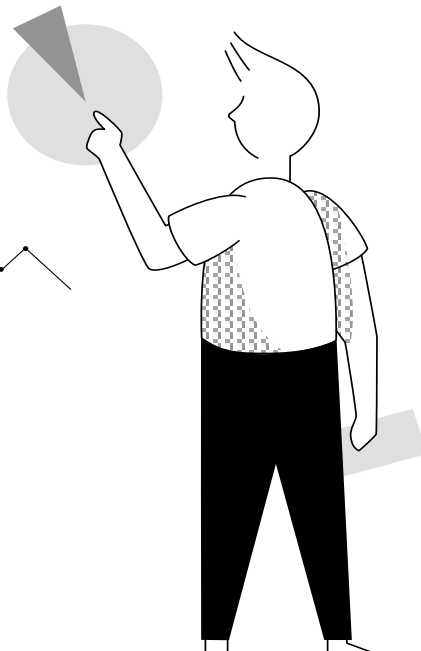
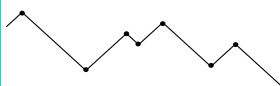
All participants will receive a professional certificate signed by P2I and the European Commission.



Path2Integrity offers a solution: A six-hour workshop for you

Path2Integrity has developed a six-hour workshop. The workshop, which is led by university professor Dr. Prieß-Buchheit, is based on the European Code of Conduct for Integrity in Research (ALLEA 2017).

In an engaging way and through a dialogue with English-speaking high school and Bachelor students (16-22 years) from all over the world, up to 300 participants will be introduced to the topic of **"Research procedures in experiments for high school students"**. All participants will be asked to actively engage in dialogue with their peers on this topic.



The workshop includes the following learning objectives:

- describe the values of a researcher
- outline reasons in favour of conducting responsible research
- acknowledge the consequences of research
- argue in favour of the importance of reliable research results for both research and society
- accept ambiguity: be open and unprejudiced
- explain and justify research procedures
- compare and prioritise different research procedures
- explain and justify your research procedures to other researchers
- realise self-declarations to follow research integrity
- make a students' pledge of research integrity together with the dialogue group
- compare and prioritise solutions of research integrity issues

How does the six-hour workshop work?

Working conditions: Each student needs an internet connection and a PC/tablet to work with. Up to two students can work together on one device at a time.
